Package for STOODIS Youth Program

Our S.T.O.O.D.I.S. Program was formerly known as the Youth Program. The acronym STOODIS stands for **S**upporting **T**eens **O**pen to **O**pportunities through **D**istinctively **I**ndigenous **S**ervices. STOODIS is dedicated to empowering Indigenous youth in care by providing a safe and nurturing environment that fosters personal growth, resilience, and cultural identity. This program focuses on supporting smooth transition into adulthood while offering opportunities for skill development, community engagement, and meaningful connections. Through mentorship, cultural teachings, and advocacy, S.T.O.O.D.I.S. aims to inspire youth to stand strong in their identity and navigate their journeys with confidence and purpose.

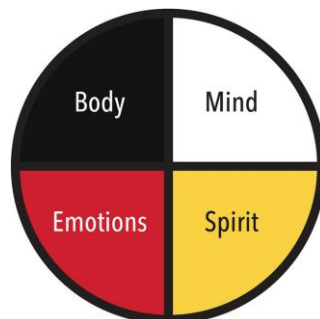
As this youth program *enriches deep cultural roots that support growth*, it also allows children to walk in a way that guides them to discover their individual identity, interests, and gifts.

NohKohWaa has Facilitators onsite who are specially trained in **RedPath** which is an accredited program and is Indigenously led and developed using a 'trauma informed approach'.

Nohkohwaa Staff are **SIVA** trained, giving them a more compassionate and proactive guide to behavior management and again, using that same trauma informed approach.

NohKohWaa **connects youth** to Indigenous languages, ceremonies, Elder teachings, healing opportunities, counselling, Indigenous equine therapy, life skills, land-based education, career goal setting and so much more.

NohKohWaa's Centre is an **Indigenously led charity and program**, that is community based, community focused, community supported, and community directed for all People and all Families.

S.T.O.O.D.I.S. Program Criteria

- ✓ Child/Youth in Care
- ✓ Between the ages of 12 – 17-year-olds
- ✓ Not actively using alcohol and/or illegal drugs
- ✓ Open to a healthy lifestyle
- ✓ Must be open to attending school
- ✓ Must attend all NohKohWaa's Programming, such as; RedPath, Equine Therapy, Life Skills, Counselling, Ceremonies, Events, Appointments, etc.

Programming from September to June:

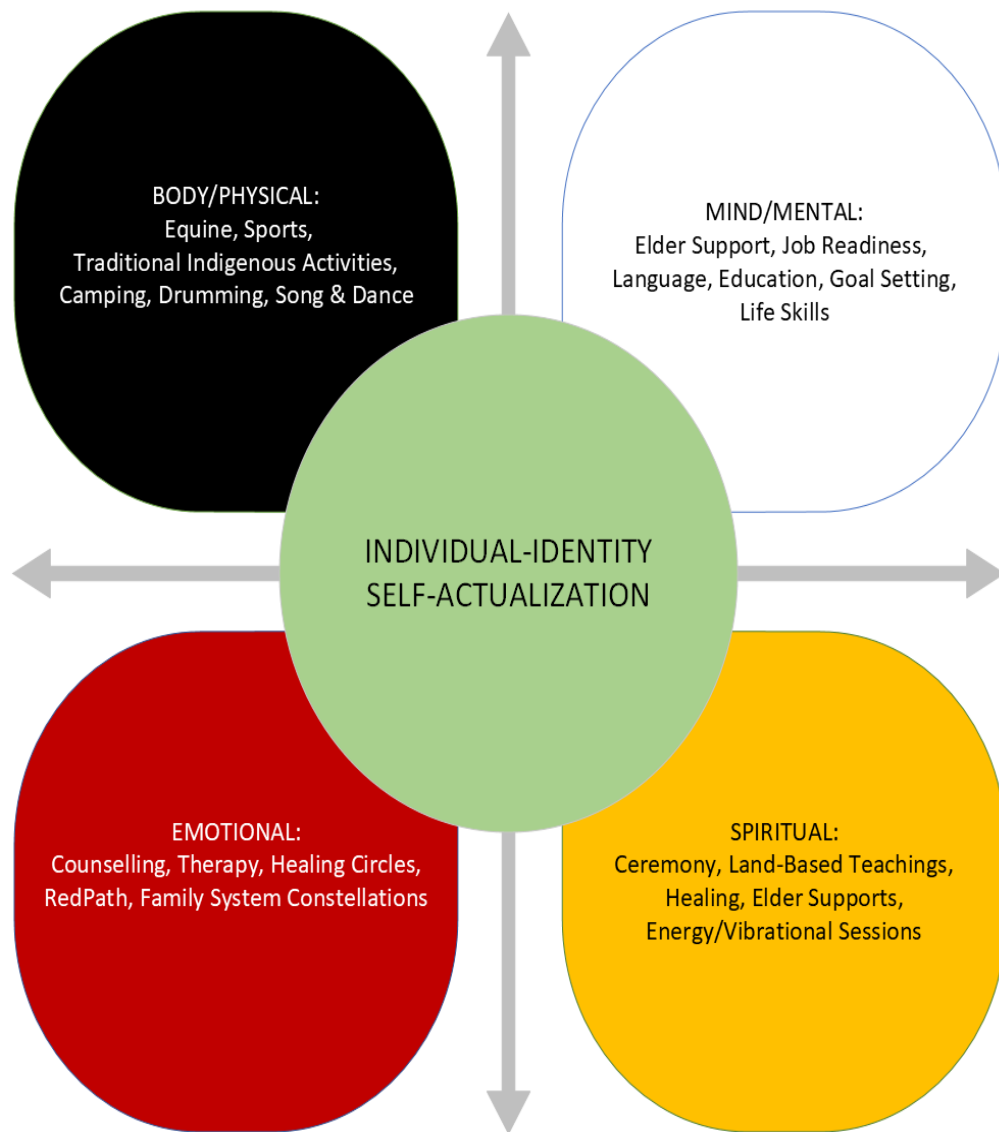
- RedPath
- Education
- Sports
- Job Readiness
- Introduction to Life Skills
- Indigenous Language Classes
- Indigenous guided Equine Therapy
- Land-based Teachings
- Indigenous Elder Support
- Cultural Activities (examples depending on interest: drum making, individual moccasin making, designing their own ribbon shirt/dress/outfit)

The Process:

- Step 1: Get a **Referral**
- Step 2: You must meet the **Criteria**
- Step 3: Complete SELF-ASSESSMENT aka **Intake Form**
- Step 4: An **Interview** will be set up
- Step 5: Welcoming **Ceremony**

DESCRIPTION OF REFERENCES

RedPath is a psycho-spiritual-educational program aimed at addressing trauma through culture, art, and traditional teachings. The approach taken is appropriate to the age and stage of the participant. With the increasing rate of suicide, bullying and criminal behaviors (especially in gangs), it was decided to develop a program geared for Children and Youth.

SIVA (Supporting Individuals through Valued Attachments) is a more compassionate, proactive approach to behavior management using SIVA and the WISE Plan to help clients map out a plan and succeed in the program. When severe/violent outbursts are displayed, this puts both the client, the worker, and/or others at risk. SIVA provides caregivers, families and clients tools and practical knowledge to create an environment where safety is a pro-social, healthy, and respectful part of day-to-day living.

Land-based Education typically uses an Indigenized and environmental focus by first recognizing the deep, physical, mental, and spiritual connection to the land that is a part of Indigenous cultures.

Family Constellations, also known as Systemic Constellations and Systemic Family Constellations, is a therapeutic method which draws on elements of family systems therapy, existential phenomenology and is Zulu (African) based beliefs and attitudes to family.

PROGRAMMING AND SUPPORTS PROVIDED BY NOHKOHWAA FAMILY & YOUTH CENTRE

NohkohWaa Family and Youth Centre, operated by the Shintah House Foundation, delivers culturally rooted, holistic supports and services for Indigenous children, youth, and families. Designed to foster a strong connection to Indigenous culture and identity, our programming emphasizes wellness, belonging, and growth through a balance of mental, physical, spiritual, and emotional care.

Our services are provided in collaboration with Designated First Nations Authority (DFNA's) across Alberta, and we extend our offerings to contracted services with other Nations across Canada.

Core Services Provided:

→ **Basic Care \$485/day**

Safe, nurturing living environments for Indigenous children and youth.

Provision of nutritious meals, clothing, hygiene supplies, and other essentials.

Supportive supervision to ensure the well-being and safety of individuals in care.

Assistance in daily life activities and life skills development.

All basic requirements are followed as detailed in the Family Enhancement Act (employee training, meds stored safely, fire safety, nutritious foods, safe environment).

→ **Cultural Programming \$48/day**

Opportunities to learn and participate in traditional Indigenous practices, ceremonies, protocols, and teachings.

Weekly Blackfoot Classes led by Traditional Blackfoot Teacher

Weekly Healing Circles and group teachings with NohKohWaa Elder

Access to other Elders and/or Knowledge Keepers, and cultural mentors from clients original Home Nation to guide personal and community connections.

Attendance to traditional ceremonies throughout the year; Sundance, sweats, bundle openings, pipe ceremonies, and any other appropriate ceremonial opportunities that may arise.

Programs that teach Indigenous languages, arts, and histories.

Weekly cultural activities and/or crafts, such as making moccasins, drums, beadwork, protection pouches, to name a few.

Equine Therapy and healing work with horses.

Land based learning through Elder teachings about plant medicine preparation and uses, harvesting and preparing of food and plants, as well as planting and growing our own medicine.

→ **ISTTO'T (aka Family Unity) Support - Clinical Support/\$20/day**

NohKohWaa strives towards creating a family environment for all children and youth.

All our programs consist of various Indigenous staff from local nations throughout the province.

Services are aimed at re-uniting children with their families and communities whenever safe and appropriate.

Culturally informed mediation and family counselling, and individualized counselling.

Assistance with understanding and navigating family dynamics within Indigenous and Western contexts.

→ **Additional Clinical Services**

Flourish Play Therapy and Counselling is in a partnership with Shinah House Foundation (SHF), where NohKohWaa is a project of love, under SHF. Flourish Play Therapy and Counselling provide a Clinical Wellness Lead where we have a working agreement to provide NohKohWaa with consultation, supervision, and any training required for completing the role expectations of NohKohWaa Family & Youth Centre. In addition to this, Flourish Play Therapy and Counselling will support the clinical mental health needs of the youth and individuals receiving support at our Centre. The goal of our work together is to support integrating, applying, and learning support strategies appropriate for families, children, and youth. In this role the Clinical Wellness Lead will support mental health needs and holistic wellness for staff and clients, as well as coordinate the Cultural Triage meetings, provide the coordination and integration of culture and ceremony guided by the Four Directions of Wellness: Mental, Physical, Spiritual, and Emotional. The Clinical Wellness Lead facilitates the accredited training of SIVA: Supporting Individuals Through Valued Attachments. This role includes training, coordination, implementation, and supervision of SIVA in the NohKohWaa Home.

→ **One to One (1:1) Specialized**

NohKohWaa provides comprehensive support services tailored to meet the needs of high-risk clients.

Our one-to-one Support initiative is designed to offer continuous and personalized assistance, ensuring a holistic and cultural approach to development and well-being. Key Features of our One-to-One Program are 24/7 consistent care, including schooling, recreation and leisure activities, cultural teachings, as well as daily living, social and life skills guidance to build independence and confidence.

Our approach is trauma informed, with a wrap-around supportive environment that empowers high-risk

children and youth to thrive. Through a committed support team and a personalized approach, we strive to make a meaningful difference in the lives of those we serve.

→ **Educational and Recreational Programming**

Support for academic achievement through tutoring and collaboration with schools.

Activities that promote physical health, teamwork, and personal growth, including sports, arts, and outdoor education.

Mental Health and Wellness Services.

Access to culturally competent mental health professionals.

Support for trauma recovery, grief, and loss through traditional and contemporary approaches.

Programming designed to build self-esteem, resilience, and coping strategies.

Community Engagement and Relationship Building.

Opportunities for clients to build meaningful connections with their cultural community.

Partnerships with local organizations to foster inclusion and mutual support.

Events and gatherings that strengthen community bonds and cultural pride.

Specialized services.

Tailored supports for youth with complex needs, such as developmental disabilities or behavioral challenges.

Crisis intervention and emergency support services.

Transitional support for youth aging out of care, including career planning and independent living preparation.

This comprehensive range of services ensure that NohKohWaa Family & Youth Centre not only meets the immediate needs of children and youth but also prepares them for a thriving future rooted in their Indigenous identity and community.
